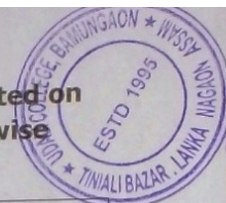

Finally, with the help of the Principal and other teachers, the participated students were distributed Participation Certificate after their successful performance.

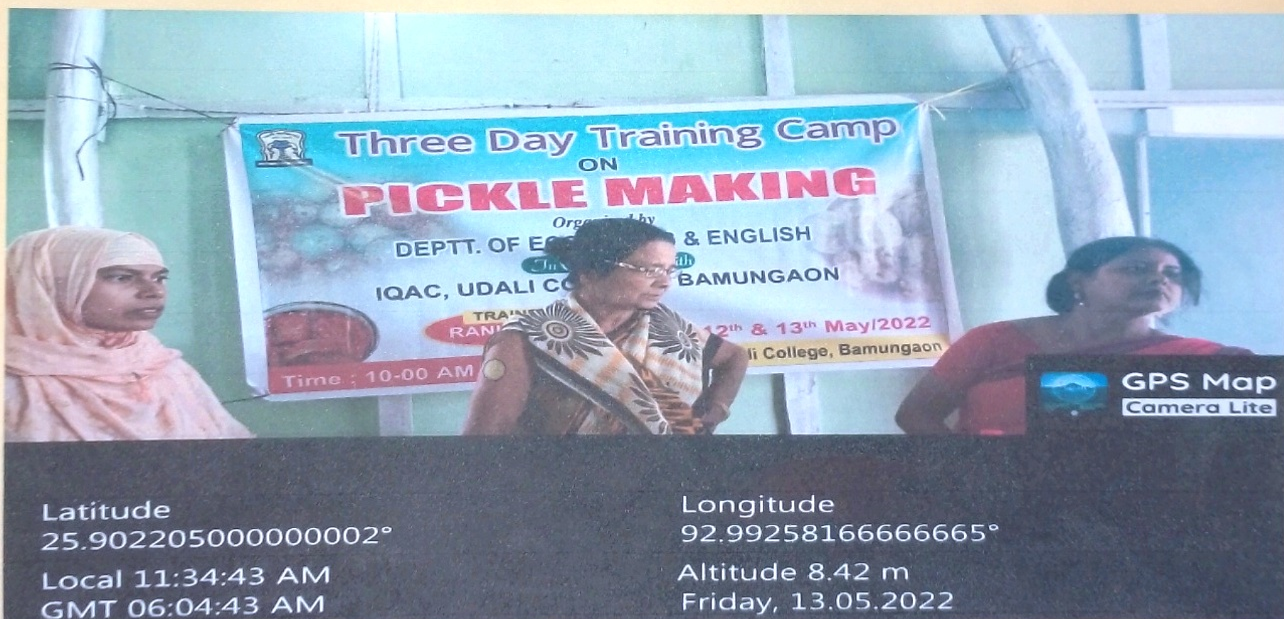
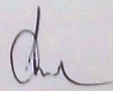
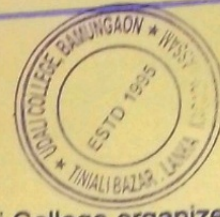

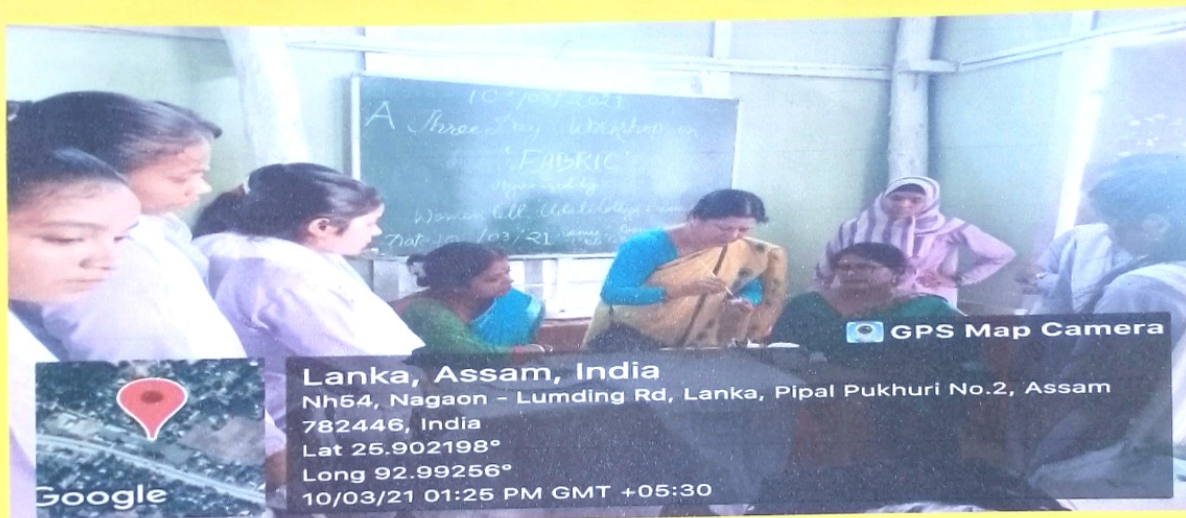
Report On Fabric Painting

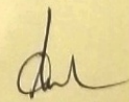

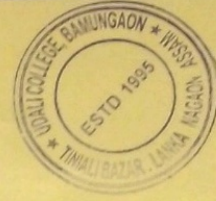

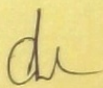

Threeday Workshop on Drama(Acting)



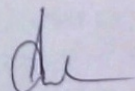

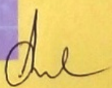

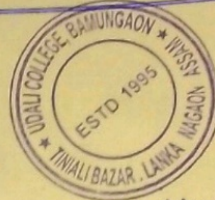

On the last day 11-7-18 the participants were asked to present and perform a few acting clips to test their learning experience. Workshop certificates were distributed among the participants.

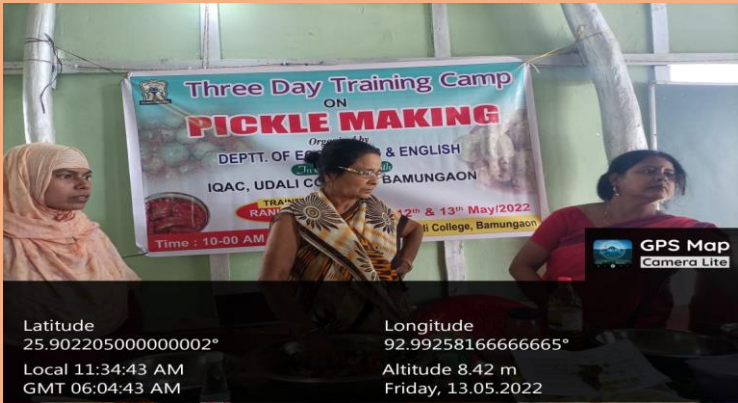
